I only use non-aggressive, force free training methods based upon the science of behavior and behavior change. These force free methods are recommended by educated Veterinarians and Veterinary Behaviorists, American Animal Hospital Association, American Veterinary Medical Association, American Veterinary Society of Animal Behavior, and modern dog trainers like myself.

As such, I do not permit the use of choke, prong, when your dog is in my care. I also do not permit the use of dominance-based training, including knee jabs, scruff shakes, side kicks, alpha rolls, spray bottles or any other forceful, painful or aggressive training methods. Shock devices can be considered as a aversive 'training' tool and are not typically recommended for effective behavior change and modification. That being said sometimes the use of a bark collar or training collar may be needed. By signing bellow you agree to the use of either. Safety and setting up success for you and your pet is of utmost importance. We follow common sense and recommended guidelines.
